Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Cum Christo community was recently blessed by our spring Men's 155th Weekend, twenty four beautiful new Babe Chicks, and a spiritual closing at First Community Church. What a wonderful "first" weekend of our Golden Anniversary Year. We welcome with joy our new Babe Chicks!

Sponsors, we appreciate and congratulate you on your diligence in discerning and sponsoring these men. Please continue to nurture their spiritual growth by encouraging them to group, by bringing them to Ultreyas, and our many other Cum Christo events. A special thing to do for your candidates would be to bring them to our upcoming **SEDER MEAL**, which will take place on Wednesday, April 16th (the evening before Holy Thursday), at First Congregational United Church of Christ on East Broad Street, beginning at 6:30 pm. Check our website www.cumchristo.org for more details and to make reservations. We encourage the entire community to attend. If you have never experienced our Seder Meal before, it is a wonderful combination of prayer, singing, fellowship, and good food — (when do we not eat in CC??)

The first Women's Weekend of our Golden Anniversary Year, the 150th, is coming up soon, April 3rd through 6th. Rector Susan Willeke and her team are in the final weeks of preparation. At present we have fourteen candidates, enough for the weekend to take place, <u>but</u> – the recent Men's 155th had 24 candidates. Would it not be great to double the number of women candidates for another full and vibrant spring weekend?? Please continue to discern candidates and get those applications in. Also, it is not too early to start discerning candidates for our fall weekends. They will be upon us before we know it – time flies!

The replacement of our poor old boiler is taking place, but it is not a quick overnight process. We will be without heat for a few days in March while the new boiler is installed. As you know, our building sustained significant water damage due to broken pipes during the prolonged cold spell this past winter. Thankfully our insurance has covered much of the damage. In an effort to control the expenses of repairs (and be good stewards of our finances) our building manager Sonny Beem, Ann Finn, and a team of helpers have been hard at work refurbishing the areas of damage. The building is now useable for weekends and Ultreyas, but there is still work to be done. If you can lend a helping hand, please contact Sonny for dates and work hours.

Finally, some of you have asked for an update on Cliff. He is now out of ICU and on the 9th floor in the James. He is still receiving transfusions, as he is unable to hold a sufficiently high hemoglobin. He is terribly weak, and the weakness has extended to his throat muscles, affecting his ability to swallow and to speak. He is not allowed to have anything by mouth because the impaired swallowing puts him at risk of liquids or food getting into his airway, so he is currently receiving nutrition through a nasal tube. The doctors have been unable to identify a cause for any of this, so basically they are keeping him alive by treating symptoms as they arise. So he is very ill, but we trust in the goodness of our Lord and we rely on the prayers of our community. Thank you so much for your prayers and support. (Cliff is able to have visitors at James 9th floor room 953, but he can't talk clearly. There are no restrictions on visiting hours.)

And to close, a little quote: "Jesus Himself has willed to conform by a comparison our faith in His sanctifying influence: "I am the vine," He said, "you are the branches" (Jn 15:5). The branches have life, but they do not themselves provide the sap which nourishes them. They are constantly drawing their vitality from the sap which comes from the parent stem. Coming itself from another source, it is this sap which gives them life.

And so it is for the members of Christ: their good actions, their practice of the virtues, their spiritual progress, their sanctity, belong to them certainly; but it is the sap of grace coming from Christ which produces these wonders in them: "As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abide in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me" (Jn 15:4). The repairs and cleanup from the water pipe break are coming along nicely and almost complete. The bathrooms are nearly finished with minor details to be completed. In our Lounge, on the second floor, a bathroom cabinet and wall-to-wall carpeting should be installed soon. Lastly, the new boiler is here and currently being installed and should be completed in time for the Women's 150th Weekend.

We have had to update our plumbing pipes, because of several leaks as we were making repairs. We have made some changes to the Spiritual Directors Room—increased its size, now sleeps up to six (6) people—and decreased the size of the Pantry Room, but have added upper, overhead storage and additional shelves for weekend and service products and supplies. We are cleaning, organizing, creating and utilizing storage areas in as many rooms as possible. We will be developing a Master Inventory manual showing where items and supplies are located at the Cum Christo Center, as well as developing a better and clearer labeling system of filing cabinets, cupboards and shelves.

Table of Abundance of Joy

The 2013-14 Sustaining Fund Campaign has received \$31,547.73 towards our goal of \$35,000. Our goal of \$35,000 is **the bare minimum** that Cum Christo needs to meet our annual operating expenses for 2014.

In addition, Cum Christo has received \$5,655.00 to date for the Peggy Bryant Memorial Scholarship fund and hoping to grow that with additional memorial funds throughout 2014. If you need to access the scholarship funds, a request outlining your reasons for needing a scholarship should be written and attached to your weekend application for processing as well as consideration.

If you have not given to the 2013-2014 Sustaining Fund Campaign, <u>please</u> consider a gift soon to help us reach our goal of \$35.000. Remember, any monies received over the goal amount will go into the Sustaining Fund to help guarantee our future.

Upcoming concerns:

Is the unknown amount we will be asked to pay in April for the installation of the new boiler following the Men's Spring Weekend. We only have a small amount set aside for this expense. Plus the additional repair costs that are being discovered from the water damage while the project is in progress. The crew is striving to keep costs to a

minimum, however, it is anticipated after labor costs that this project cost will be higher than funds provided by the insurance claim due to some minor improvements being made at the center in conjunction with the project.

Both of these concerns are *current expenses* for Cum Christo this quarter and next quarter which will be above our normal rent of \$1,600.00 per month.

<u>Please Note:</u> If you are sponsoring a candidate for the weekend the cost is now \$150.00 for the weekend. (Breakdown is: \$25.00 non-refundable deposit with application and \$125.00 cost for the weekend payable before or at the conclusion of the weekend.)

As a reminder, if you have not signed up for the Kroger Points Reward – now is the time. By signing up, Cum Christo receives quarterly 1% of what is being spent at Kroger's of those registered. Best part is that registering does not affect your Gas Points! Go to www.kroger.com to register. Our total is growing to be almost \$125.00 per quarter now for Cum Christo. De Colores
