Of course, there are times when the Lay Director(s) need to make a decision quickly; we often consult with the spiritual director in these cases.

It had all the news for the preparation of the upcoming Weekend known at the time it went to press - some two to three weeks before. Of course an updated candidates list was available at "Guardian Angel Ultreya" or at the Center on Thursday, Friday or Saturday; but that meant I had to sit in the kitchen in the midst of meal preparation activity to write spiritual feelings to those who were not on the Quiri's original candidate list. After all, I didn't just want to "grab a few", I wanted to offer my prayer and support to ALL the participants of the Weekend.

Then God gave us the gift of immediacy; the ability for us to quickly obtain up-to-date, even up-to-the-minute, Weekend information - the Cum Christo website. As candidates are processed through the application system or voluntarily drop from the Weekend, the webservant is notified immediately of the additions or deletions to the candidate list. ## The Relevance of CUM CHRISTO in Today's World

I'd like to take us back to the late 1940's, to the founding of the Cursillo Movement, upon which, as we know, our Cum Christo Movement is based.

What the "founding fathers" of the Cursillo perceived at that time was a world with its back turned on God and Christ. They felt that life had ceased to be Christian because the influence that Christianity had on real life was nearly nonexistent. Those who were still believers often had a distorted or diluted view of God, of other humans, and of the world. Does this not sound very much like the world in which we live today?

In *The How and the Why*, written by the founders Eduardo Bonin and M. Fernandez, we find this excerpt: "To be effective, therefore, every apostolic solution will have to be focused on human life, which continually needs to be baptized anew....The world itself needs to be reconstructed, down to its very foundations; it needs to be transformed from savage into human, and from human into divine." Their goal clearly was to re-Christianize a society that had ceased to be Christian.

Faced with the reality of this de-Christianized world, the founders of the Movement discerned the following lines of action:

- Evangelization as a mission
- Awakening a hunger for God
- Preaching and proclamation aimed at conversion
- Viewing the Christian as an apostle in his/her everyday life
- Holding a vision of the world as a community of persons God wants to redeem
- In summary: The actual living out of what is fundamental to being a Christian

Happily, they also provided some suggestions for putting into practice these actions:

- Recognize our Christianity as something alive that must be lived
- Develop a new Christian attitude in carrying out our existing secular commitments
- Live out our Christianity in the world in which we have been placed, not just in church
- Present to people the most basic truths about God, Who alone can fulfill our deepest desires
- In summary: To live out one's human vocation in accord with God's will for us and for the world

The fathers concluded that the world has been given to we Christians as our workplace, and that we must courageously immerse ourselves in it in order to influence it, to conform it to God's will, and to leaven it with the Gospel – a solemn and weighty duty to be sure, but we are not without tools provided by the Cum Christo Movement: Piety, Study, Action, communal prayer and worship, and Christian support and fellowship in Group Reunion and Ultreya.

We have the mandate and the power to transform people individually, to create more Christian structures, to transform already existing structures, and to give a Christian backbone to the world, one person at a time.

## **Web Servant Cont.**

For the team this means that no one is left out of the Palanca process because their name didn't make it in the Quiri. Guardian Angels are not filtering out Palanca notes and gifts for individuals who dropped off the Weekend days before it began. Every candidate going into the Weekend has a "Guardian Angel", picked from the previous Wednesday evening, praying for them throughout the three days.

For the Kitchen coordinators, the website means that they are able to post the latest list of meals that they need volunteers for - not what was needed two weeks ago before a lot of people called to volunteer.

Am I advocating the website as a replacement for the Quiri? NEVER! The printed Quiri/Quiri that arrives in our mail is a valuable source of information and inspirational articles from our leadership. And for those who do not have access to the internet (or simply choose not to involve themselves with this media) the Quiri remains the only Weekend informational source.

But the Cum Christo website at [www.cumchristo.org](http://www.cumchristo.org) remains a necessary and welcomed addition to the Quiri; part of Cum Christo's continuing effort to keep its members well-informed and up-to-date with what's happening in our movement.

I ask all of you who have internet access to get into the habit of visiting the Cum Christo website in the day or two just prior to the start of a Weekend. Print out the updated list of candidates who are about to begin that special walk with Christ, and make use of that list by doing Palanca and praying for the candidates and team; write letters of palanca to each one of them and take those notes of prayer to the Center by Saturday morning of the Weekend.

For those of you without direct internet access, see if a friend or relative who is "wired" can print the list off for you, and make use of that list by supporting the people on the Weekend in their walk with Christ.

By the way, when the Quiri goes to print, a PDF of that edition is posted on the web site at <http://www.cumchristo.org/quiripage.html>.

The Quiri/Quiri and [www.cumchristo.org](http://www.cumchristo.org) will remain partners as your informational resources for years to come. I ask that you make good use of both as you support those making their Cum Christo Weekend journeys... in prayer, with your written words, and with your time.

# **PSYCHOLOGY of CUM CHRISTO**

## **PART 1**

Psychology has been defined as “the aggregate of mental and behavioral qualities typical of a group or one of its members”. Sounds pretty complicated, doesn't it? Another definition that applies is “a personal attitude or belief.” I can understand this one. The 3-Day Cum Christo Weekend is not a marathon group therapy session, nor is it a series of exercises using group dynamics to get people to think or behave in a certain way. The Cum Christo method does not brain wash people. It simply allows them to discover and to become.

The psychology of Cum Christo is a simple one. It is the philosophy of love and acceptance--one of our most basic human needs. True, it does build on certain psychological aspects of humanity and employs a lot of dynamics, but again, not to manipulate but to allow.

The purpose of Cum Christo is neither to sow nor to harvest. Not to sow - the candidates should already be Christians. Not to harvest - it's unimportant how many candidates witness at a closing. The important thing about Cum Christo is how many people get into a group reunion. Jesus didn't baptize. He was simply present to the people - He touched them. Our purpose, therefore, when we are on a weekend team is to be present to the candidates - to touch them - to be Jesus to them - to, in a sense, manure what is already there planted but dormant. This is why it is so important that the team "BE" what they claim to be, rather than just talk about it or go through the motions. They have to walk their talks.

Our method, then, is a gradual one, allowing the candidates to open up slowly, as a flower: petal-by-petal. The gradual progression lessens the chance of a candidate rejecting a concept as simply too much or too difficult to deal with. This is why the progression of the weekend is so vitally important and must not be, as it has not been in over sixty (60) years, tampered with.

## **PART 2**

The weekend progresses slowly over three days. The candidates need time to discover themselves - just who they are and where they are in their walk. This is the reason for the retreat phase on Thursday night. Some of the candidates carry a lot of dead wood around with them, along with many different fears and insecurities. No one can get rid of the "junk" all at once. The discovery process is a slow one, from the slow beginning of Thursday night and Friday to the "I can do it!" of Sunday.

As I said in Part 1, the Cum Christo method is built on certain aspects of humanity and it does use certain dynamics to allow the candidates to feel the love of their God and the love of the Community. Every human being has a basic need to be accepted, loved and affirmed. One can only grow as a human being according to the degree of acceptance or rejection we feel or have felt in our lives. The candidates need to feel, to experience the unconditional love of God - not just hear about it - in order to grow.

There is a reason for each of the dynamics employed on the weekend. **THERE'S A REASON FOR EVERYTHING IN CUM CHRISTO.** The dynamics are present to enable the candidates to feel loved, accepted and affirmed, both by the team and by one another. (cont. on page 9)



## **PSYCHOLOGY of CUM CHRISTO Cont.**

Singing helps to build the community from the very beginning. Serving meals and clearing the tables allows them to take on the role of servant hood that they have been hearing about. The applause when they introduce themselves helps them to feel affirmed. There is a gentle progression of everything on the weekend. The candidates can only give what they are capable of giving, and receive what they are ready to receive. If we move too fast, the whole concept could be too overwhelming and misunderstood

### **PART 3**

In our everyday lives, there are always three elements involved---our thinking self, our feeling self and our behavior: HEAD, HEART, and HANDS. In order to be comfortable and to fully involve our will, these three need to be in sync. What the weekend tries to do is just that - get the three in sync, in balance. With our head, we hear about God's love for us and about grace through the talks, the personal witness, and the sharing. We feel God's love through the team, the other candidates themselves and the greater community through palanca and the closing.

Once the awareness of God's love has been experienced with both the mind and the heart, the will to project that into our daily lives will be a natural response to our faith and our actions will be real and effective, not forced or simply a role we play. The team begins the weekend with the three elements, HEAD, HEART, and HANDS, in sync. The rector has worked during team formation to see to it. To the extent that the candidates arrive apprehensive, confused, and questioning, the team arrives motivated and ready to go.

The tendency for the team is to go downhill as the candidates go uphill. Somewhere on the weekend, the two cross - often sometime on Saturday. The team is tired; they see the community that has formed among the candidates. Team must be present to the candidates and must remain motivated and enthusiastic right through to the closing, because the method to sustain and direct this response to Grace comes on Sunday, the most important day of the weekend. The rector introduces grouping, and it must be witnessed to positively and enthusiastically by the team.

### **PART 4**

What Cum Christo seeks to do is to make apostles out of already committed Christians. The team is only a catalyst. The candidates really give the Cum Christo weekend to one another. The talks and the witness only help them to discover themselves. And as they begin to share themselves with one another at table, but more importantly during mealtimes and chats during breaks, the miracle of Cum Christo happens, with the gentle nudging of the Holy Spirit.

It is often said that the reason Cum Christo exists is to place people in group reunions. That is true. When the weekend is over, it is in group reunion that we have that "safe place" to share our Piety, Study, and Action, our successes and our failures, our strengths and our weaknesses. And no matter what we share, we experience that unconditional love of our group members, and therefore, the unconditional love of our God.

All in all, the team's job is a simple one, yet one that takes a great deal of work and "time on task" during the three days. They must show, through what they are rather than what they say, that a life in grace and the peace and joy that go with it is not only attainable, but more importantly, sustainable, through group reunion and Ultreya - the tools of perseverance of Cum Christo.
