Cursillo started here in 1964. In 1971 we began to be ecumenical. In the mid 1980's when national Cursillo withdrew from the ecumenical style movement, we wished to remain ecumenical and did so with the support of Bishop Griffin. At that time we changed our name to CumChristo. In all matters but our name (our mission, our style, our substance, our method,) we are virtually identical with the Cursillo movement. ## Grouping 101

Grouping is the core activity used by CumChristo and all other Fourth Day programs to live their lives in grace. Each week they gather with a small group of like-minded individuals to pray and share their faith along the three dimensions of piety, study, and action. Following are some questions asked by members.

**Q.** What is the most important element of the CumChristo Movement?

**A.** Post CumChristo. It is easy to convert people to Christ, but it is much harder to get them to follow Him. The CumChristo Movement is basically a program that teaches us to "Walk with Christ". Group reunion and Ultreya are meant to help persons persevere in living the Christian life in an ongoing way. But it is a choice; all that CumChristo can do is give individuals a chance to participate.

**Q.** What is the difference between a group and a reunion?

**A.** A group is the community of persons gathering. A reunion is the periodic gathering of the group. In the concept of 'group reunion', there is no reunion unless there is a group of persons to make one, and there is no group unless it makes a reunion.

The group reunion has two elements—the group (of persons) and the reunion (the group coming together). Combined, the two elements constitute the total reality of a group reunion, which can be defined as a group of Christian friends who gather together on a regular basis to become better friends and better Christians.

**Q.** How big should a group be?

**A.** No more than 5 or 6 people. Otherwise it is a crowd. Besides taking too much time to make a reunion, the more people involved in the group, the more time it takes to develop the basic ingredient of friendship.

**Q.** How long should a reunion last?

**A.** At an Ultreya, 20-30 minutes. With

a friendship group outside of an Ultreya, whatever is convenient for the members, usually one hour.

**Q.** Why are some people disillusioned by the group reunion?

**A.** Because they emphasize the mechanics of the reunion rather than its spirit, and because they fail to contribute to it the fruits of their life as a Christian in the past week. They come to the reunion to be nourished, rather than to nourish it with the fruits of their apostolic efforts.

The testimony to the success of the group reunion from those who live it is sufficient to overcome any and all criticisms of those who have not lived it. The weekend was actually developed to give people a little course in Christ and propose the CumChristo

method of Ultreya and grouping as a way to be Christian in the daily world.

If you are a member of Columbus CumChristo and are looking for a group or have a vacancy in an existing group, you may use the website to post your search by completing the online card under Grouping at [www.cumchristo.org](http://www.cumchristo.org). Groups and individuals may also post or check for openings on the bulletin board in the CumChristo Center. One other method is talking with your sponsor. They may have an opening in their group, know of an opening, or may be willing to group with you while you search for your group. DeColores!

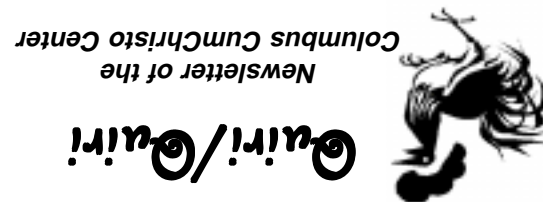
## **How can I get involved and support the Columbus CumChristo's Ultreya?**
