In this edition of the Quiri Newsletter please read of the many "happenings" in the Cum Christo Movement that indicate that Cum Christo is very much alive and very active. Here we want to again give you a feel for what is happening from our perspective.

We have applied to the Diocesan Finance Office for inclusion in the Catholic Conference Group Ruling which means that if accepted Cum Christo would be under the umbrella of the Diocese of Columbus and included as a tax exempt charitable group. If not accepted Cum Christo will apply to the IRS for our own tax ID number and then reapply to the Diocese to be included in the group list of charitable organizations. Either way we will become a tax exempt charitable movement in the eyes of the Diocese and the IRS. Please pray for the success of this initiative.

An amicable agreement has been reached with the St. Vincent DePaul Society regarding the St. Lawrence Haven use of the basement facility of the Cum Christo Center. Their Board has agreed to help defray some of the cost of our utilities in addition to their monthly rent. We are pleased with the result of several months of discussion. It is a win-win situation for both parties. Please give praise and thanksgiving to God.

We have begun a new program within the Pre-Cum Christo section called the Pastoral Outreach Program. The purpose of this program is to enlighten pastors of the purpose of Cum Christo and to disseminate our literature to the pastors and parishes. We then want to discuss with their church leaders our purposes and the potential for bringing new candidates to Cum Christo who will then return to their churches and environments as active leaders. We want to expand this program first from churches which have been inactive in Cum Christo to churches throughout the Diocese. We will send representatives in teams of two to pastors and churches from the central Ohio area first and then to outlying areas of the Diocese. This will eventually result in not only increased numbers of candidates but kinds of outreach programs such as Weekends and Ultreyas in outlying parishes. Under the direction of Ed Price, a past Lay Director, we have had an initial meeting with Pre-Cum Christo parish representatives. Those representatives who missed the first meeting and those of you who would like to get involved in this exciting program are welcome to attend future meetings. There will be training sessions before sending our representatives into the parishes. As this program develops and widens its scope it will gain momentum and have tremendous impact on the Cum Christo Movement and on the parishes. Please get on board and help Cum Christo grow. Also pray for the success of this program. We all share in God's work.

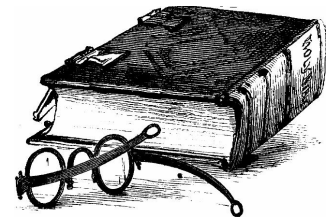

Weekend Income increased since there were 4 weekends vs 3 the year before



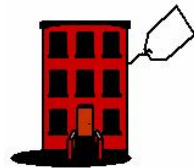
There were no major equipment or repair expenses during 2007

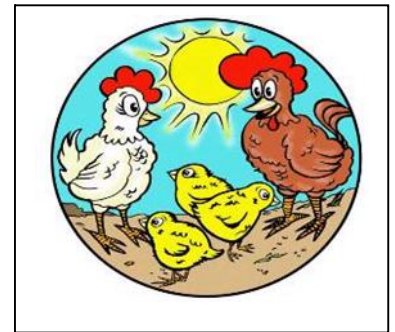

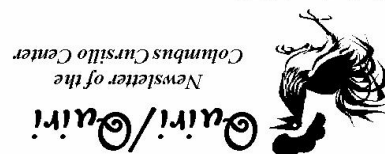
