"Let all who thirst, let them come ... (to Ultreya)" (after John Foley)

Is your spiritual life dry? Are you experiencing a desert in your life? Come to the oasis of Ultreya. Let your mind, heart and soul drink deeply of the most important element of Cum Christo: perseverance throughout your Fourth Day.

I am embarrassed at how often during the week I cannot recall the sermon from Sunday. I sat. I listened. Yet it washes over me more often than it settles in my memory. Ultreya is different. I have greater retention. In recent months I have heard many inspirational talks, and I have remembered key points!

- Someone helped me, an artistically challenged person, to read God's handwriting through photographs of nature: creation that is simple yet extraordinary.
- Another person explained that happiness is what we get from the world (a new car, a Florida vacation, new clothes). Joy is what we get from Jesus.
- Still someone else described having close moments during their youth offender ministry.
- Then I heard these profound words, "Deeds do not have to be big to be mighty!"

As Lay Director, I often have business to attend to and, sometimes, I miss the witness talk. One such night, while talking with someone in the lounge, they told how in their study they learned that Jesus did not call any great men to be His followers. Jesus called very ordinary men: simple fishermen (who sometimes couldn't catch any fish), tax collectors, and the like. Ordinary men who became great by following Jesus.

These simple ordinary truths speak to my heart. That is what I find at Ultreya. You too can quench the thirst of your soul. Come to Ultreya.

Did You Know?

Did you know that one of the psychological aspects of the weekend is to establish <u>a cloistered environment</u>, away from the distractions of routine life? This is one reason why we ask sponsors and family of candidates and team to refrain from working in the kitchen and only to come to the center discretely to drop off palanca and for the Serenade. This helps maintain the cloistered environment. Team members may sponsor candidates because they are part of the cloister, and in team formation they are trained how to interact under these special circumstances. The next time you encounter this situation, offer up the sacrifice of being absent as Palanca, the lever that lifts us all up.

It's a fact....

It's a fact that Cum Christo <u>team eligibility</u> criteria are challenging. First, you must have made the adult version of any three-day weekend / Fourth Day movement program. Second, you must be grouping. Third, you must have attended the Cum Christo Weekend Orientation program to learn about the inner workings of the Columbus movement. Fourth, you must be free of physical, emotional, moral, and spiritual constraints that could impact your ability to form Christian community and to witness your faith to the candidates. Fifth, you must have the time to commit to personal formation, team formation, the weekend, subsequent Ultreyas, and follow-up activities. If asked, pray for discernment knowing that the Rector has already discerned you. If while praying you hear the call, say yes.

Some people think....

Some people think that the personal touch is meaningful. The next time you go to Xerox a piece of <u>Palanca</u>, stop!. Palanca, a lever, is sacrifice on behalf of others. The message you copy may be a good one. However, the real message of Palanca is "I am sacrificing so that you may encounter Christ." Sacrifice the time and effort to send handwritten notes. Consider which would be more meaningful to you.

Kairos Koordinator

Kairos Prison Ministry is an ecumenical Christian ministry, a "Christian Community in Action", for residents of correctional institutions, that uses the Cursillo method for 3-day weekends, followed by weekly grouping, and monthly reunions, like Ultreyas. The mission of Kairos is to help build and nurture strong Christian communities among the residents of correctional institutions. Kairos is currently active in three Ohio institutions, and is doubling its ministry in the next two years.

Each institution's program requires 55-person teams for each spring and fall weekend made up of *only* Fourth Day community volunteers (Cursillo, Cum Christo, Emmaus, Via de Christo, etc.). Each weekend also requires the support of several thousand general volunteers to make 10,000 dozen cookies and to pray for the residents. Informational video and discussion sessions for new volunteers will be held after several Ultreyas during May and June: May 3 & 10, and June 7 & 14.

INSIDE CUM CHRISTO NEWS ITEMS:

"Yuletreya Makes a Difference" Sr. Mary Francis W67 (PUT Spiritual Director)

This past Christmas, the Yuletreya gift giving program involved both Christmas gifts for those families being assisted by the Choices program for victims of domestic violence, and our neighbors at Jaycee Arms who needed basic household supplies. We received gracious thanks from both, that we offered up as praise the opportunity to act on God's behalf.

"Dinner a Full-filling Experience" Steve and Hope Boring M118/W108 (Host Couple)

Our annual dinner event on January 28 saw 185 Cursillistas and Cum Christos gathered for food, fellowship and fun. We thank and praise the Lord for diligent workers who helped make the event possible, and the musical entertainment, "Quite by Accident" (barbershop) who helped us out of a financial jam by discounting their fee. For next year, we are considering beginning to alternate the event between the last Friday and the last Saturday of January, and searching for an alternative venue.

"Church Contacts Working Hard" Tim Shea M121 (Pre Cum Christo)

On February 12, church contacts gathered at the center to share and swap strategies being used to penetrate parish environments. We seek to have our regional coordinators and church contacts raise the awareness level of Cum Christo. This is <u>not</u> to "recruit" since Cum Christo is a one-on-one type of ministry. This is so that when you, or any sponsor, approaches a leader, a potential candidate -- there is an awareness, a starting point for the dialogue, and receptivity to the invitation to make a weekend.

"PUT Retreat a Holy Success" Jill McGregor W109 (Post Cum Christo)

Over 35 Cursillistas and Cum Christos gathered at the center on February 26 to learn about the second most important element of perseverance in the Fourth Day, Ultreya. Grouping is first. A series of Rollos, where speakers witnessed to the relevance of each element of Ultreya in their lives, were followed by group discussion and table sharing (no posters though.) Add in prayer and singing and you have a glorious experience. This full day training program for Permanent Ultreya Team members and interested community members will be repeated in coming years.

"Center Cleanup" Steve Cunningham M128 (Service)

Just as our spiritual lives need fixing up and cleaning out once in awhile, so does the Holy Cross Center. The Spring Cleanup in March, announced in the January and March editions of the Quiri, came and passed with a very disappointingly, low turnout. Fewer than a dozen of our 8,000 Cursillistas and Cum Christos took the time to attend to this important element of our operations. Cum Christo has no paid staff. All who work are volunteers, and those who assume coordination responsibility need help, your help. Pray about your role in the service section, and answer the call.

If you are neither a sponsor nor the spouse (or family) of a team member or candidate participating in the Weekend, sacrifice the time: call and offer your help. <u>PALANCA:</u> The essence of Palanca is a message of sacrifice. Write extra Palanca notes addressed "Dear Babe Chick" for candidates you do not know. Palanca from strangers is powerful stuff. GENERAL Palanca is introduced on Friday afternoon; deliver it as early as possible <u>Friday morning</u>. PERSONAL Palanca from sponsors, spouse/family, and guardian angels is introduced on Saturday afternoon; deliver it by <u>mid-morning Saturday</u> and write your relationship to the candidate on the envelope. Palanca from the community is distributed Saturday evening; deliver it no later than mid-day Saturday so it can be sorted and evenly distributed. Palanca in the form of gifts is distributed late Sunday afternoon before the Closing.

<u>SERENADE</u>: Sunday - Will begin promptly at 6:00 AM. Please do not bring children. For those interested, breakfast at TeeJay's on Dublin Road immediately following the Serenade.
