### From the Lay Directors

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Many of you have seen the following information in the recent Lay Directors Corner. We are reprinting it here due to the wider distribution of the Quiri. (If you're not getting the LD Corner, send your email address to the Webservant).

After nearly 18 months of work we are pleased to announce the execution of a new lease with the Diocese. This new lease will be in effect for the next five years, and we feel that it will serve our movement well. We will continue to have exclusive use of the first, second and third floors with the exception of the kitchen. Many of you are aware that we have been sharing the kitchen with Holy Cross Church for many years. We will now also be sharing the kitchen space on weekday mornings with a few staff members of St. Lawrence Haven. (SLH will not, however, be using the kitchen facility on days when one of our weekends is in progress.) We are blessed to be of assistance to Saint Lawrence Haven in their very important ministry of feeding the poor and homeless.

We are excited about our upcoming Cum Christo 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration! Jane Peden is heading a committee that is planning for a celebration that will last the entire year of 2014. A 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary is, after all, a very important milestone! Some events that are in the early stages of planning include inviting the Bishop to say a special anniversary Mass for the entire Cum Christo community followed by a reception, as well as having a special Protestant service (yet to be determined), having several "satellite" Ultreyas at different churches in the area, and several other spiritual and social events. Jane and her team would be very interested in hearing more ideas from you. Obviously much help from you, the community, will be needed to help make these plans a reality. We will need organizers, setup/takedown crews for some gatherings, food providers/servers, and other help as plans are firmed up. This would be a great Action for your group or a service-oriented way for your weekend table to reunite. We will keep you informed of progress and of the need for helpful hands as

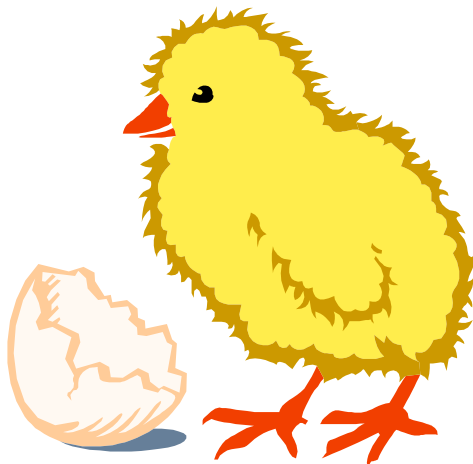

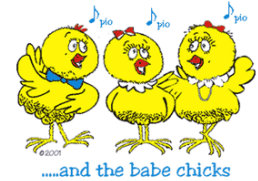

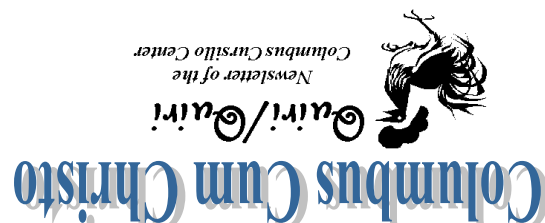
