From the Lay Directors

How many of us have bought a new appliance, a new car, or a new home recently and have used the internet to gather information before we invested the time and spent the money? We tried to make sure that it was the right thing for us to do by finding out all we could before we made the leap. Likewise in this age of information, many of our candidates come to the Weekend knowing something about the CumChristo Weekend. They want to know what it is and what it will do for them.

When many of us made our weekends, we really didn't know all that much; we trusted our sponsors when they encouraged us to "just do it!" We may have heard lines such as "It's a great weekend!" "You'll have a wonderful time!" "You'll have the mountaintop experience of your life!" Telling them that it will change their life may actually scare some people (of course, others may find comfort in that!) While these statements might be true for some of us, it is not everyone's experience.

Do you remember how you felt about making a Cum Christo Weekend before your weekend? When we talk to potential candidates about Cum Christo, let us not talk about how we feel about the Cum Christo Weekend now, looking back at the Sunday of our weekend, but let's try to put ourselves back in the place where we were before we made our weekend: the anxiety, the doubt, the unfamiliarity, the insecurity of being out of touch with the outside world for 3 ½ days.

Encourage the candidates to make a Weekend by telling them that CumChristo is a 3-day "Workshop in Christian Living" designed to enhance their spirituality, to deepen their relationship with Christ and enable them to become the leaven for apostolic action.

Tell them that the Weekend provides tools that can help Christians become the people that God is calling them to be both in their personal lives and in their environments and provides a means for similarly committed Christians to support one another in achieving this goal.

Leaders School

The Leaders School is one of the two operational structures, or instruments of organization, of Cum Christo (the other being the Secretariat). Perhaps the primary role of Leaders School is to keep the method intact, to guarantee its proper use, and to foster a way of thinking, working, and living that encourages the purpose of this movement for renewal. The Leaders School is essential to the development and continuity of Cum Christo, and acts as an instrument of apostolic outreach to Cursillistas.

In the founding days of the Cursillo movement, it was the Leaders School that coordinated, nurtured, and strengthened the fledgling movement and formed it into a place of what Pope John Paul II termed "the vocation to holiness". Members of the School are called to offer, within their environments, the witness and example of a holy life that encourages others to conversion. The School is united in an atmosphere of group reunion - that is, we begin every meeting with prayer and the sharing of our piety, study, and action, and thus we become both a group reunion and a Christian community in action.

The School is actively involved in preparing leaders for our movement, by means of education, (the imparting of the basic principles and ideals of the movement), spiritual formation, and encouraging the various means for evangelization of the environment. To be a Cum Christo leader is a specific vocation, and we need to be mindful that all of us are called to be leaders in the lives and environments in which God has placed us.

Leader Discernment Team (LDT) was established four years ago when the Leader School Long Range Planning Committee proposed the establishment of a team who would discern new leaders for our Community. Each member of the team serves for three years with two replaced every two years. Like every leadership position in Cum Christo, LDT members must: 1) Be Cursillistas who are active in the Community and who want to build the spirit of Cum Christo; 2) Must have completed Weekend Orientation; 3) Must be grouping; 4) Be knowledgeable of the history, traditions, and By-Law and Guidelines of Cum Christo and be willing to promote these to those inside and outside our Community. The current LDT members are: Judy Unger, Judy Gibeaut, Mark Pruse, Sally Zuccaro, Jerry Abraham.

There are many leadership positions in our Cum Christo Family. Our Leaders are responsible for building the spirit of and maintaining the traditions of Cum Christo while following the our By-Laws. Our leaders are asked to commit to serving our Community for two to four years depending on position. With biannual leader changes, new leaders must be identified. The Leader Discernment Team is called to identify potential leaders, to discern where these potential leaders could serve our community, to obtain Lay Director inputs and approvals, and to extend invitations to the potential leaders to join Cum Christo leadership.

The LDT is currently discerning leaders for Quiri, Weekend Representative, Application Management, Sustaining Fund Program, and two representatives for LDT. Would you consider bringing your Cum Christo experience and servant heart to work for our wonderful community? Church Contacts

With the essence of Cum Christo grounded in the Trinity and with the tripod of Piety, Study and Action, it should be of no surprise that the movement itself is supported by three distinct sections. These include the Pre-Cum Christo, the Weekend, and Post-Cum Christo. As the leader of the Pre-Cum Christo Section, I would like to remind our Cursillistas of the responsibility to share the gifts that you have received in the movement with others who can also become Leaders for Christ.

Just as someone identified your leadership potential as a disciple for Christ, you too can identify leaders within your environments. And one of the easiest environments to share this gift that you received is within your own parish or church. We have been called to know the method, live the method, and share the Cursillo method with our brothers and sisters, in Christ.

One of the ways that an individual or couple can be most helpful within their parish or church environment is to become a Church Contact. This role helps to build an awareness of Cum Christo in their church community. Through their knowledge and understanding of the movement, they can respond to inquiries of potential candidates and sponsors. They also actively encourage sponsorship of candidates from their community.

Beyond the basic role of knowing, living, and sharing the Cursillo method within their parish or church, Church Contacts have been known to identify ways to promote the method. They advertise the upcoming weekends in their church bulletins or newsletters. They may host palanca gatherings for upcoming weekends or help sponsors "send-off" their candidates with a Thursday night dinner. Some have promoted understanding of the movement through information sessions. And finally, they may be asked to serve the Cum Christo Community through hosting a closing at their church.

Discernment and Cum Christo

In Cum Christo we hear a lot about discernment. We have a Leaders Discernment Team that discerns who in our movement should be the next leaders and members of the many parts of our movement such as Secretariat, Leaders School, Pre and Post Cum Christo and all of the other sections. Rectors for our weekends are discerned and they, in turn, discern their Assistant Rectors and their teams. Discernment pervades the entire Cum Christo Movement. BUT, what is discernment?

Mister Webster defines discernment as "Acuteness of judgment; the power to perceive differences between things or ideas as well as their relationships". This may be a good definition of secular discernment but does not tell us much about the Spiritual Discernment in Cum Christo. Spiritual discernment is the process by which one discovers God's will. The process enables you to distinguish between what is coming from God and impulses that are not from God. In discernment through prayer and petition we call on the Holy Spirit to lead us and to give direction. Then we must suppress our own will and desires and listen to Him. It is how the Spirit shows the church and its people what God wants them to do and to be. Discernment without prayer, petition, and listening is useless.

Discernment and Cum Christo cont.

Cum Christo is God's movement. It does not belong to the Lay Directors or anyone in Secretariat, Leaders School or the other sections of the movement. The Lay Directors and members of these sections are servants of the movement. In the same way, the Rector of a team is not and must not consider himself/herself the owner of that team. It is not their team, it is God's team. The rector and assistant rector of a team are servants to that team as the team members are servants to the candidates that God calls to a particular weekend. Cum Christo will surely fail as many other movements have failed if we forget that Cum Christo is God's movement and we MUST discern His will, His direction, for us through prayer and petition.
