Since the last Quiri, much has been happening in Cum Christo. The Long Range Planning Team has completed their work after two years of discussion and recommendations. They raised 15 issues, some which have been approved and many which now need to be addressed by the Secretariat and Leaders' School. For example, a Cum Christo Weekend brochure and Sponsor's brochure have been developed and published for your use. The Candidate Application has been revised to allow women to make the Weekend before their husbands.

The LRPT issues tie into the Leaders' survey published in the January 2007 Quiri, which helped establish our vision and goals, such as developing the Spirituality and Life of the Movement through Education, Leadership, and our Traditions.

As these develop we will keep you abreast of the Secretariat's decisions on these issues in future publications of the Quiri.

But from our perspective, it all boils down to one thing: *Cum Christo needs you to sponsor more candidates for the Weekends.* We suspect that because wives can now make a Weekend before their husbands, there are fewer men disposed to make the Weekend. That means a more concerted effort on all of our parts in necessary. Cum Christo needs you to bring candidates to Jesus Christ so they can build a deeper relationship with Him and become leaders in their fourth day as you are. So, make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ. You can make a difference.

The April Women's Weekends is fast approaching. Pray, study and act. Do you have a "Spiritual Bouquet" to offer the team and candidates?! Christ is counting on you. Be a loving Sponsor. Give your Love away. The Love will come back to you a hundred fold. His name is Jesus!

Dear friends, it has been said, "Living the Christian life is not difficult, it's impossible!" No man or woman has the strength of will and purpose to always make the right choices. Have you built accountability into your Christian lifestyle? In our world, consumerism (the idea that progressively greater consumption of goods is beneficial) and secular humanism (the idea that man establishes his own moral values apart from the influence of anyone, including God) are all around us. How, then, are we to progress as Christians?

The answer is **accountability**. We need to hold each other accountable, that is, to be regularly answerable for each of the key areas of our life to someone we love and trust. Have you ever asked someone to hold you accountable for an area of your life? Has anyone ever asked you to hold him or her accountable for an area of their life? It's not such a radical idea! For us as Christians, the purpose of accountability is to each day become more Christ-like in all our ways, and to strive to be more intimate with Him. That's what being a Christian is all about...

We all need help to stay on track: in our relationships with God, our spouse, and our children; in our use of money and time; in our moral and ethical behavior; and in areas of personal struggle. We need regular contact with an "accountability partner," someone who can be our spiritual "confidant."

Why be interested in our accountability here and now? Because of our eventual accountability *there*. Each of us is accountable to God for every aspect of our lives. ("So then, each of us will give an account of himself to God." *Romans* 14:12) Think about it... Who can you trust to hold you accountable in your life? Blessings to you and yours.
