A Message From The Lay Directors

Dear Community,

We would like to share with you a view from this position. Being lay directors means one has the opportunity to go to a lot of meetings. The movement has been very busy lately. Throw in an ultreya team along with secretariat, leader's school' long range planning team, and a miscellaneous section meeting or two and one starts to wonder if this position would be better staffed with a much younger person.

But in the midst of all that "busy-ness" we have had pause to reflect on the process and how sanctifying each is. Each begins with prayer and sharing and then ends with prayer. In between, there is often passionate debate about specifics and/or the general direction of the movement. What we have come to learn is that the respect and love we have for each other at these meetings because of Jesus and because of that framework (prayer, sharing, and prayer) is just as important as the outcome of any particular discernment.

In prayer and sharing we humbly recognize our "creatureliness" alongside fellow creatures. This gives us the freedom to see a particular question from another point of view. Sometimes our initial opinion may not carry the day and that is ok.

Having had the opportunity to join in many of these meetings has been a beautiful witness to us and we have begun to see the wisdom in this process. The sharing never fails to touch us deeply and teach us something about our God and ourselves. Perhaps the most important part of each meeting is the closing prayer. It is there where we say to God, "Thanks for putting us together. It has been joyful to work alongside all who gathered here this evening. Please stay nearby Lord We still need your help. Amen ."

Highlights of the Cum Christo Year 2005 Financial Report are:

Year 2005 operations and weekend expenses decreased 16.4% from 2004.

Our utility costs decreased by 23%. This in large part is due to the water leak of 2003 & 2004.

Of the total decrease of \$3,859, approximately \$3,288 was due to the decrease in the Center's water bill.

Postage costs decreased 16%.

Updating the Cum Christo database with current information saved us \$692.42.

Trash removal increased 20% (\$4,744.94).

Increased service costs. The addition of a dumpster for cardboard.

Miscellaneous Expenses decreased substantially.

In 2004, we purchased a multiple years of pewter crosses for weekend closings. We did not have this purchase in 2005.

Please note the number of Projects that were started and completed this year.

We ended 2005 with Account Balances totaling \$50,300.05. This is only through your generous donations, monetary and services provided to the community. Thank you to all and God Bless.

New Guidelines for Sponsoring Married Persons On Cum Christo Weekends

The Long Range Planning Team

Cum Christo Lay Leaders Sukey and Joe Di Cesare introduced the Cum Christo community to the new guidelines for sponsoring married persons on weekends in the January edition of the Quiri. The Long Range Planning Team proposed these new guidelines after very extensive research in other fourth day movements and churches. The guidelines were approved by the Secretariat last October. The guidelines are to be reviewed by the Cum Christo leadership in 2008. In order to help Cursillistas to embrace the new guidelines and to apply them in sponsoring people for Cum Christo weekends, the complete text is provided below.

Guidelines

Cum Christo encourages both spouses in a marriage to attend a Cum Christo Weekend, so they can share the benefits of the weekend and enjoy together their opportunities to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ in their family, church and other shared environments.

Ideal Way

The ideal way for a Cursillista to approach a married person about considering Cum Christo is to arrange a meeting with both spouses. Both spouses would thereby have the opportunity to learn about Cum Christo firsthand and in each other's company. Each spouse would have the opportunity to get questions answered by the experienced Cursillista and to have their spouse ask his/her own questions and to hear the answers.

During this meeting the spouses would be invited to pray to discern whether God is leading them to attend a Cum Christo Weekend. The sponsor would encourage the spouses to communicate with each other about this opportunity to attend a weekend and then give their decisions to the Cursillista who has offered to be their sponsor. Neither spouse might attend. Both might commit to attend. Or one spouse might decide to attend soon and the other spouse might not make a commitment about Cum Christo.

Alternative Way

Frequently, however, a Cursillista has a close relationship with one spouse in a marriage but not the other. And sometimes it is difficult or impractical to follow the "ideal way" described above. In these situations, it is also acceptable for a Cursillista to meet personally with the spouse that he/she knows well, educate them about Cum Christo and invite him/her to consider and pray about attending a Cum Christo weekend. The Cursillista would urge the prospective candidate to share all information about Cum Christo with his/her spouse and to collaboratively reach a decision about having the "prospective candidate" attend a Cum Christo Weekend. Experience shows that if one spouse attends fourth day weekends like Cum Christo, the other spouse frequently attends a weekend in the next several years. So, by one spouse attending a Cum Christo Weekend, frequently the other spouse attends later.

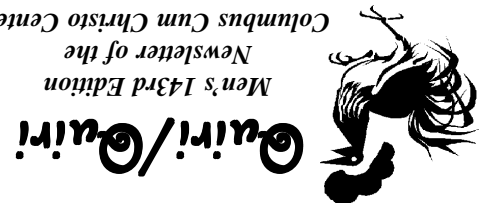
