When I was in elementary school, some sixty years ago, the good nuns taught us to write what was called a "spiritual bouquet" to our mother on special occasions like Mother's Day, Christmas and Easter. The spiritual bouquet, which was hand written on folded paper with flowers or pictures we drew on the front, usually in pencil and crayon, consisted of each individual's gift to their mother. I always felt good to go home and give my "spiritual bouquet" to my mother. Being a spiritual gift, we wrote that we would offer our Sunday Masses, maybe 2 or 3 Rosaries (that was tough for a kid), 5 Our Fathers, 10 Hail Mary's and 15 Glory Be to the Father's (ranging from the longer to the shorter prayers).

I remember thinking, "Don't make them too many, you won't be able to get them done." Come to think about it, I don't remember finishing them. And my mother probably knew I wouldn't. The intent was there, and she cherished those letters of love. After she passed away, I found some of them in a little shoe box which caused my to stop and reflect back. .

You get the point. That was true palanca! Anything you do that exacts a price from you for another as a labor of love is true palanca. Thoughts, prayers for others and prayerful action is palanca. Whether you write them down and give them to the intended person(s) or write them in your heart. Yes, baking dozens of cookies for a Cum Christo Weekend is a labor of love and, therefore, palanca. Even little physical gifts like flowers, candy and tokens can be considered palanca if the giver's intent is willful blessings on another.

You see the difference between the "spiritual bouquet" and the "physical bouquet." That's why we call palanca a lever with God.

Prayer backed up by action is powerful. Have you thought of a spiritual bouquet and action? Wednesday Ultreyas need your presence on Ultreya teams.

With the next two weekend teams in formation and the two weekends coming up soon, won't you please sit down, pray and write one "spiritual bouquet" (palanca) to someone? After all it is an act of love. I bet many of you have the palanca you received on your weekend in a little shoe box. Cherish it don't you?

It's hard to believe that we have completed almost two months in the New Year. Ash Wednesday was February 23, and the Lenten Season has begun. We have pulled out the purple vestments and clothes to decorate the church.

During this season we need to be thinking: What am I going to do differently this coming Lent? What things will I give up? Will it be smoking, giving up swears, eating between meals, alcoholic drinks? These are good in themselves, but where do they get us? We might lose a few pounds or overcome some difficult habits. But how do these things really prepare us to celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ?

Maybe we should be thinking of: working in a soup kitchen; visiting the elderly of our parish or a nursing home in our neighborhood; making sandwiches for the open shelter; taking time to dust off our bibles and reading the scriptures daily or reading the daily readings for Mass and spending some time in personal reflection.

If we are on the Prayer List for the upcoming Men's 144 in March or the Women's 136 in April, perhaps, we might spend our time in prayer. But this time, we will not pray at home or our parish church but spend that time in the chapel in the Cum Christo Center. This would probably be palanca for most of us, since we would need to schedule and drive down to the center. God is inviting us to take a few steps toward Him, so He can take giant leaps toward us. Reflect upon the grace that God wants to pour out this season. Highlights of the Cum Christo Year 2006 Financial Report are:
Cash Flow is Reported on a Cash basis for the Year Ending 12/31/2006.

- *Utility Costs increased by 28% following a decrease last year when new windows were installed.
- *Postage and printing costs increased since new materials were printed this year.
- *Trash removal costs grew more than \$5,000 this year; changes instituted by Secretariat should result in a significant reduction next year.
- *We were negatively impacted as a result of having to cancel the Men's Fall Weekend.
- *During 2006 we acquired new chairs and a new commercial range for the kitchen.

“Bringing More Candidates to Weekends”

The Cum Christo Long Range Planning Team (LRPT) finished its work after two years of dealing with 15 different issues related to the organization, operation and marketing of Cum Christo. The consensus of the LRPT at its final meeting was “getting more candidates to Weekends is the single most critical issue for the leadership of Cum Christo to focus on and deal with.”

It should be no surprise that the LRPT made many recommendations to Secretariat and Leader’s School related to bringing more candidates to Cum Christo weekends:

- + Produce a new Cum Christo brochure targeted to prospective weekend candidates (Which is already printed and being effectively used by cursillistas.)
- + Produce a new brochure targeted to pastors, priests and lay church leaders. Contains endorsement statements by Bishop Campbell and six pastors/priests. (It will be finished, printed and distributed in June.)
- + Produce a 15-minute video about Cum Christo (proposal is still under consideration by Secretariat).
- + Produce a first-ever “Sponsorship Brochure.” (The brochure is finished, distributed and being effectively used).
- + Form a top-level permanent Cum Christo Marketing Committee that would report to the Secretariat. This committee would reach out to clergy in churches that have very few or no cursillistas and invite them to personally select members to attend a Cum Christo weekend.
- + At the second Ultreya after every Cum Christo weekend, have the main speaker’s presentation be on “sponsorship.” (This could be a witness talk or a “continuing education presentation.”) The goal is to get babe chicks enthusiastic and equipped for sponsoring candidates—while they are still attending Ultreyas.
- + On Sunday of Cum Christo weekends, have the Rector give a more encouraging and enthusiastic message to candidates about having them become sponsors of candidates—soon. Replace the current cautionary sponsorship message in the Rector’s script.

The “Day To Remember” at Upper Arlington Mill Run Lutheran Church led and guided by Father Vinny was a day I will always remember. Ben McCoy, Julie Glowacki and Dan Hill were gracious in sharing their musical gifts with us that day.

One of the key moments for me was when Father Vinny talked about how important it is to say, “I believe in you” to someone. It’s almost easier to say, “I love you,” than to say to someone, “I believe in you.” It made me think about my own life when different people have come into my life and said, “I believe in you, Joe.” One of those times was when I was told those words by two of my bosses, I had just recently been promoted to a new position in the company. I really wasn’t sure if I could handle all the problems I had inherited. I was a little overwhelmed. I remember that day well. The owner and the vice president came to Columbus to pay me a visit. They took me to lunch. At lunch, they told me that they selected me for the position because they believed in me. I remember Gordon saying, “Joe, we selected you because we have every confidence in you that you can do this job. We believe in you, we know you can do it.” The owner ended that lunch telling me how he and the vice president loved me like a son. There was no way I wanted to let my boss down after that. If someone believed in me, that meant I darn well better deliver and do a good job for them.

I also had a 7th grade history teacher that communicated that he believed in me. I worked so hard in that class because I knew he believed in me. And there have been other times that people have communicated belief in me. I walked away thinking how I must make sure I am giving the blessing of belief to my children, my wife, and my associates at work. I was also reminded that there is someone even greater that says to me that they believe in me, and that’s God my father, Jesus my brother. God believes in me even more. I can’t let the Lord down.

Father Vinny showed us how we can even communicate belief in another when we show forgiveness to another person. He used the example of how Jesus forgave Peter. Jesus basically said to Peter, “I forgive you, I still love you, and I believe in you enough to still trust you to feed my lambs.” Father Vinny told us that to be trusted and to communicate trust in another person is one of the most important steps in forgiveness. “I forgive you. I understand you. I love you. And I still trust you.”

During the day, I remember singing “Yahweh, I Know You Are Near.” I could sense the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in the room that morning. This day, once more, blessed me far more than I gave.

I’m looking forward to getting together with all the musicians at the next two closings. (Men’s 144, March 11 and Women’s 136, April 22, 2007.) Please know that if you play a musical instrument, we want you to come and join us! The music is pretty basic. You are always welcome to play at Ultreya’s, serenades, and closings. 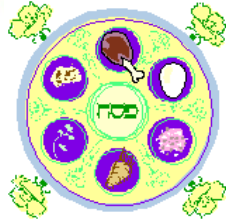

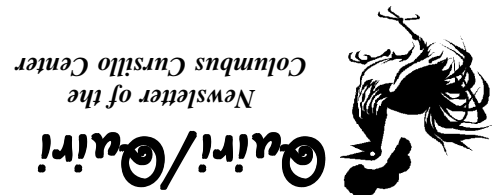
