The Spirit is active and alive in Cum Christo, as was evidenced again and again on the last two Weekends! We will continue these educational talks for the September and October Babechicks and then evaluate their effectiveness.

Speaking of Ultreyas, they are meant to be times of renewal, times when we get plugged back in, times when we persevere and recommit to Jesus in our Fourth Day, times of prayer, reflection and meditation. Isn't that reason enough for you or your group or a Church group to consider attending Ultreya and becoming a member of an Ultreya Team?? Or providing an outreach Ultreya in your church?

Next, we have formed a new committee, the Leadership Replacement Committee, to do just that, to find and discern new leaders to replace Secretariat section leaders and others in leadership positions in Cum Christo whose term of volunteer service has expired or who simply seek to serve in another capacity. This committee consists of Sukey Di Cesare, Elaine Beem, and two newcomers, Judy and Tom Moore. This committee will report their recommendations to the Lay Directors. To be considered by this committee for a leadership position in Cum Christ, you must be grouping, have made Leaders' School Weekend Orientation and be able to commit to the Cum Christo Movement for three years.

There are always leadership positions opening up in Cum Christo. Leadership positions, which are presently open, are: Quiri Editor and Pre-Cum Christo Section Leader. Rather than waiting for the Leadership Replacement Committee, one of the leaders or Lay Directors to call you, please let us know if you are interested in serving in Cum Christo. 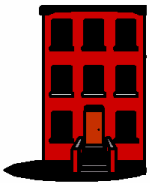
## Chapters

**The Cum Christo bylaws for Leaders School Team are the following:**

### Overview and Duties

1. The Leaders School Team has primary responsibility for the study and guidance of the Cum Christo Movement. It is to keep the essence of the Movement at the forefront of the community's life and activities and to improve the sense of accountability within the community. In acting as the link between all other sections, the Leaders School Team is to coordinate and synthesize the work of all sections. It is to assist in the implementation of all the sections' plans, as well as those of the Secretariat.
2. This section will be knowledgeable as to what is happening within the community and thereby determine its existing needs. Such needs are to be communicated to the Secretariat. The task and goal of this section is to improve communications when necessary.
3. This section shall be directly involved in long range planning and assist the Secretariat in the setting of priorities and goals. It will act as a consultant and advisor to the Secretariat at all times.
4. The Leaders School Team will keep the essence of Cum Christo at the forefront of the Movement as embodied in the original Cursillo literature and subsequent interpretations within the Columbus Diocese.
5. The Leaders School Team is the working body of Cum Christo. It is responsible for the spiritual formation and ongoing study of the core elements of the movement by the people who are leading the Movement.
6. The Weekend Representative shall serve as a voting member of Leaders School.

### Purpose

Developing new promotional materials including a brochure that will give clergy additional insights to effects parishioner-congregations who attend Cum Christo weekends can have on their church and church ministries and develop a DVD that shares the excitement and spirituality of a weekend with potential candidates. With growth in the number of churches in the area, we will be faced with the challenge of carrying the Cum Christo spirit to the new churches by carrying that spirit to their pastors.

The Pre Cum Christo Group is always looking for new people with fresh ideas and most importantly an enthusiasm for Jesus Christ and a willingness to share that enthusiasm with others who Jesus wants at a weekend.

### Easter Joy

The Gospels after Easter Sunday lay great stress on the appearances of Jesus to his disciples. On Tuesday, "Mary Magdalene stood weeping outside the tomb." Mary was almost frantically searching for Jesus-but she didn't at first recognize him when she found him. Perhaps she was weeping so copiously that she couldn't see through her tears. But this is a thread that runs through several of those 'close encounters of a most unusual kind' that the disciples had with Jesus after his resurrection. They didn't recognize him. Jesus was not a resuscitated corpse. He was beyond time and space but he was present to people who were in time and space. He was different-yet the same! When they did not recognize him, they were absolutely sure it was Jesus.

Mary thought he was the gardener. (As a matter of fact, she was right: Jesus is the gardener of the New Creation.) She recognized Jesus only when he spoke her name.

The two disciples on the way to Emmaus thought he was merely a stranger. They almost recognized him when Jesus opened the Scriptures for them and explained the passages pertaining to himself. But the full realization came only when he broke bread with them. Their eyes were opened and they recognized him. "And were not our hearts burning when he spoke to us!"

The gardener, a stranger, the Scriptures, the breaking of the bread: At first their eyes were held—but then they recognized him.

As it was in the beginning, so it is now—with us. So often our eyes are held and we fail to recognize Jesus among us. He's come to us as he did to Mary Magdalene when we seek him, sometimes in tears. He'll join us as he did the two disciples, when we share our thoughts and hopes about him with each other. He'll open our minds and hearts as we search the Scriptures, looking for him. And he comes to us in the breaking of the bread where we can not only recognize him as our Risen Lord but let his life mingle with ours. Open our eyes – we want to see Jesus!

## What Does the Weekend Representative Do?

When I was asked to begin training as the Weekend Representative for Cum Christo last August, I had no idea what adventures awaited me! I have been an active member of the Cum Christo community for over 30 years. I have sponsored candidates and served on numerous teams. It always amazed me that all the details of a weekend seemed to somehow magically get done, and I never really thought too much about who did what. Well, that has all changed now! Being a part of the "behind the scenes servants" has already enriched my life!

What do I do? For one thing, I attend monthly Secretariat and Leaders' School meetings. Many important decisions need to be made on a regular basis for the Cum Christo movement to remain strong. Jesus is always at the center, and His willing servants prayerfully make decisions and establish policies, which help make our Columbus Community of Cursillistas a thriving body of Christians who love the Lord and wish to spread His word to others.

In addition, I arrange Closings for the weekends with every attempt to schedule these events at churches the Rectors select. We have a pre-Closing meeting at the church as the actual date draws near. I also attend Rectors' School and participate in the Discernment process where future rectors are recommended.

Did you ever wonder who reminds the photographer, luggage coordinator, and bus driver about the weekends? It's me! I will send letters to all of them once the year's weekends are scheduled and then follow up with reminders as the weekends approach.

Another special benefit of being Weekend Rep is attending and participating in the Team's Commissioning Service prior to the arrival of the candidates. This is a blessed time for Team, family, and friends as they begin the weekend for which they have been preparing.

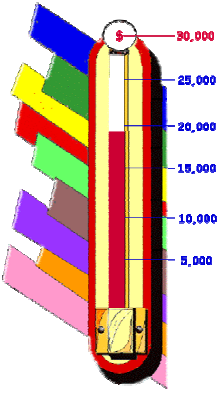
Once the weekend is over, the Rectors attend a Leaders' School meeting and critique their weekend. This includes all kinds of information, which is helpful for future weekends. I carefully read through the manuals used by the Rectors for any suggestions, additions, corrections, or errors, and make sure all manuals are updated correctly.

At the Closing, I greet the candidates on the bus and escort them into the church. I make sure they enter the sanctuary by table. Once the Closing ceremony is over, I escort them to the reception, which is a lot of fun as they may ask me many questions. Their enthusiasm is a blessing and quite contagious!

I am involved in preparing the calendars for each year's weekends. Close attention to time changes and OSU football games are important factors to consider!

I am also the keeper of the keys to the Center for the Rectors, an awesome responsibility!

There are probably more responsibilities I have not discovered yet, but with God's guidance and the wonderful support of my predecessor, Judy Gibeaut, they shall be revealed! I look forward to serving our vital, Christ-centered community in any way that will glorify our Lord! DeColores!

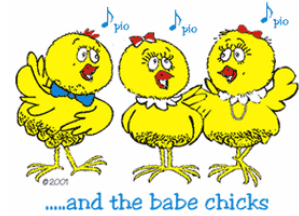

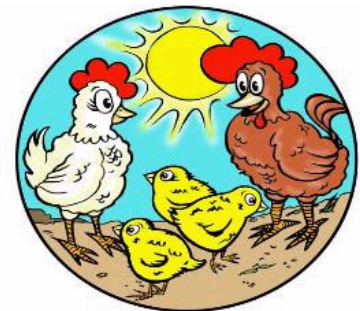

Begins promptly at 6 a.m. Please do not bring children. For those interested, breakfast at TeeJay's on Dublin Road will follow the serenade.

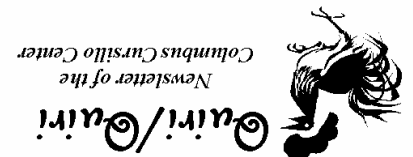
