Please pause and say a prayer of thanksgiving and praise for those who have completed two years of service and for those who have committed their services to Cum Christo for the next two years.

It is obvious that the Leader Discernment Team has done a tremendous job in helping the Lay Directors identify and discern new leaders, and we are very grateful.

Next, you may recall that last February we filed with the Diocese of Columbus for inclusion in the United States Catholic Conference Group Ruling which, if accepted, would have made Cum Christo a charitable, tax-exempt organization within the Columbus Diocese and, therefore, with the IRS. That application was denied last May which lead us to apply to the State and the IRS for tax-exempt status as a charitable organization.

As of June 18, 2008, Cum Christo became incorporated when Articles of Incorporation were filed with the Secretary of State. Cum Christo is now a tax-exempt, charitable organization in the State of Ohio with our own tax identification number (cont. on page 3)

The Task at Hand

Our task with spiritual growth is not merely to get "holy," not merely to think holy thoughts so that we can experience the presence of the Holy Spirit, but to "exercise ourselves into godliness." Our task is to remove the self-imposed blocks or character defects that stand between God and us. We do this so we can be awakened, meet God personally with our own true selves, and do his will. To wake up and get at this task was also the purpose of the saints in their spiritual disciplines. (A Hunger for Healing by Keith Miller p. 6)

I have been interested for some time in "Twelve Step" spirituality based on the twelve steps of Alcoholics Anonymous. These steps have been helpful for many who seek recovery from alcohol and drug addiction. The principles of these programs seem to embody eternal truths about the spiritual life.

Keith Miller applied the twelve steps to the Christian life in his book, **A Hunger for Healing: The Twelve Steps as a Classic Model for Christian Spiritual Growth** (San Francisco: Harper San Francisco, 1993). Miller became well known as a Christian writer in 1965 with the publication of **A Taste of New Wine.** Since that time, he has been a successful Christian leader, businessman, writer, and lecturer.

However, he makes clear in his book that he was a "control freak" who operated out of a deep fear of not being accepted and of financial insecurity. He was a second son who never felt that he could live up to the expectations of his father, and his experience of the great depression led him to anxiety about his financial situation no matter how successful he became.

Miller found help in the twelve steps which called him to growth through humility and powerlessness. These principles are embodied in the first three steps. Step one is to admit that we are powerless over our addictions and that our lives have become unmanageable. Step two is to come to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity. Step three is to decide to turn our will and our lives over to God as we understood him. A friend of mine has summarized the first three steps as follows: "I can't. God can. I think I'll let him!"

Miller's understanding of the twelve steps is that they help us remove stumbling blocks to our "waking up" and becoming the people God created us to be. This is our task whenever we engage in spiritual disciplines of any kind. We surrender to a loving God who knows us and has given us gifts for service to others. God frees us to give those gifts away.

It seems to me that Cum Christo does just this. Through piety and study, we submit our very lives to God who came to us in Jesus Christ and empowers us to take action. While we may not be in a twelve step program, we can know the power of turning our lives over to God and seeking to do God's will wherever we find ourselves and in whatever circumstances. This is the task at hand each and every day.

DISCERNMENT

"What do you want of me, Lord?" We, as Cursillistas, want to know, and have piety as part of our daily lives to try to listen to the Holy Spirit to guide our actions and thoughts. The prayer we use to open our grouping sessions starts with "Come, Holy Spirit". This listening to the Holy Spirit is discernment.

In Cum Christo management we also ask for guidance to discern our journey. Part of this course is discerning rectors. On August 23, the 2009 rectors and assistant rectors attended Rector School, and were given their manuals and handbooks. In July, the 2010 rectors were discerned. I ask you to pray for these men and women as they undertake a huge responsibility. The 2009 rectors and assistant rectors are: Jerry Judge & Dan Hill, Donna Shea & Deb Hill, Tom Craft & Bob Bruce, Nancy Meyer & Tami Robbins As of this writing the 2010 rectors had not yet accepted their positions.

Lay Director's continued.

We are now in the process of applying to the IRS for our federal tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code. To do this we need to re-write our By-Laws to meet IRS requirements which include additions of legal paragraphs, clarifications and language.

All of this caused us to ask important questions and provide more exact answers to the IRS as to who we are, what our purpose is, what our organizational structure is, etc.. In order to accomplish this huge task we first organized a legal team consisting of two Cum Christo legal experts, Frank Martens and Jeff Glasgow who offered their services gratis, our Treasurer, Mike Chambers and the lay director. A first draft of the revised By-Laws with the legal inclusions and clarifying statements answering the above questions was written and then sent out to a By-Laws Committee consisting of eight other current leaders in the Cum Christo Movement, four from Secretariat and four from Leaders' School. Several revisions followed which included the committee's suggestions.

The legal team met to develop a final draft on July 29, 2008, which was immediately sent out to the By-Laws Committee for final approval. As of this writing, August 1, 2008, we are waiting for feedback from the Committee members. In all, twelve Cum Christo Leaders have had the opportunity for input into the revisions. We will present the By-Law revisions to the Secretariat for the first reading at the next Secretariat meeting, August 5, 2008. By the September Secretariat meeting we hope to have the By-Laws approved and then sent in to the IRS in order to have IRS approval and incorporation inclusive of the year 2008.

We are very hopeful that these revisions in the Cum Christo By-Laws, done prayerfully and in consultation for the betterment of the Cum Christo Movement will be permanent and place Cum Christo in good stead for many years to come. The next step after IRS approval will be to fine-tune the By-Laws and to re-write the Guidelines to match them.
